## Emergency Medical Technician—Basic

You will learn how to respond quickly to high-level emergencies such as heart attacks, motor vehicle accidents, and other life-threatening injuries and illnesses.*

Course description: Covers the minimum level of certification for ambulance personnel. Students learn to properly perform the various skills utilized by emergency medical technician level pre-hospital care providers in the care of sick or injured persons. This course prepares the student for the Maryland and National Registry EMT certification written and practical examinations and follows the guidelines established for EMT training by the DOT/NHTSA national standard curriculum.

Requirements: Assessment levels: EN101/101A, MA091, RD120, or consent of department. All students must maintain a 70 percent average and can score no lower than 60 percent on any of the assessments. Failure to maintain a 70 percent average will result in the student being dropped from the program. Because of national and state requirements, all classes have mandatory attendance. Students must also provide criminal background check and proof of negative TB test.
